

Of the newcomers, the 'Real Deal' Nick Francis was the first to settle with impressive tackling and great pressure. He created a passage of play with MJ Jefferson, the Volvo and Leeshan straight through the centre and into the goal square before a magnificent snap by the Laser Lasscock saw the Redbacks on the board.
